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Hello Everyone!

In Japan, summer arrives along with the rainy season, the period that is referred to as both **Tsuyu** and **Baiu**, literally meaning plum rain in Japanese, as it coincides with the season of plums ripening. During this season there are many cloudy and rainy days, but it is the best time to enjoy viewing beautiful flowers such as hydrangea, iris, water lily, etc., that thrive in wet weather. **Teru Teru Bozu**, sunshine charm dolls made of white tissue paper or cloth, are traditionally hung outside of windows to wish for sunny weather. June is also an exciting time for picking cherries and blueberries in the Akagi and Komochi areas. There are also some small shops that sell delicious strawberry sherbet, cherries and blueberries.

Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy hiking and mountain courses along the Kanto Fureai Road. Also, bungalows and barbecue pits are available at the Komochi Maple Village and Akagi campsites.

Summer solstice, or Geshi as it's called in Japan, falls on Friday, June 20, this year.

Father's Day is called **Chichi No Hi** in Japan, and it falls on the third Sunday of June (this year, on Sunday, June 15). This holiday gives people a chance to express their thanks for their father's love and hard work.

Miyada Firefly Festival (宮田ほたる祭り)

Watching the fantastic dancing lights of fireflies is a truly magical experience. Two different types of fireflies, Genji firefly (Luciola cruciata) and Heike firefly (Luciola lateralis) can be seen in the Akagi Machi, Miyada Hotaru no Sato (Firefly Village), from mid-June to the end of July. Entrance is free! The Firefly Festival will be held on Saturday, June 14, from 7:00 pm to 9:30 pm.

Inside the festival area, there will be food stalls, so you can enjoy delicious local foods.

Free parking is available at Akagi Utopia. Please refrain from parking at the festival site.



Shinkoji Temple Hydrangea in Full Bloom (アジサイが見ごろ「真光寺」)

Shinkoji is a famous temple that is said to have been founded in the Heian Period by the monk Junichi Doshi. The temple was under the guardianship of Shingen Takeda (the nineteenth head of the Takeda clan), a samurai commander in the Warring States period (Sengoku). The temple was ranked among the Kanto region's five major temples of the Tendai sect. There are several cultural assets in the Shinkoji precincts such as the temple's large bell "Ogane" (prefecture designated important cultural property in the "Shoro" (bell tower). Shinkoji is known as Ajisaidera ("Hydrangea Temple") because hydrangea bloom all over the temple grounds during the rainy season. There are more than 3000 shrubs of hydrangea in the beautiful garden of the temple and from around late June to early July they will color the ground of Shinkoji temple and the surroundings. Hydrangea Festival (あじさい祭り)

In early summer, over 8,000 hydrangea plants of 20 species paint Onoike Ajisai Koen with vibrant shades of blue, purple, pink, red and white. A festival is held annually to coincide with the blooming period of these brightly-colored and cheerful flowers, this year from Saturday, June 14 through Sunday, July 6. Wind chimes and lanterns decorate the park, adding a touch of color and offering a refreshing feeling. During the event period hydrangeas are beautifully lit up in the evening, from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Visitors can enjoy not only the beauty of hydrangeas but also various activities, including an exhibition, wearing Japanese traditional umbrellas (wagasa), and many more. Booths will be set up at the bicycle parking lot within the park on Saturdays and Sundays, from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm, offering food, drinks, and also free rental of Japanese umbrellas. The access to the park is free of charge.

Parking is available at the Onoike Ajisai Koen. In addition, the parking lots at Ryokoji and Shibukawa Hachimangu can be used during the festival.

An original artwork exhibition of the manga artist Ike will be held during the event period at Shibukawa Civic Hall Lobby, from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, every day except Mondays. Admission is free of charge. Goods related to characters that appear in Ike's manga work "Nekomusume Michikusa Nikki" and posters of the Ajisai Matsuri will be on sale and a stamp rally will also take place during the event.

Shibukawa Skyland Park (渋川 スカイランドパーク)

The Shibukawa Skyland Park provides a lot of events during this month. You can enjoy the panoramic view of Shibukawa from the Ferris Wheel, various attractions, and viewing hydrangeas. About 5000 Annabelle hydrangea or "White Lady" shrubs are planted in the park and when they bloom they look great, like a carpet. The best time to see Annabelle hydrangea in the Park is from late June to mid-July. The entrance ticket during the peak of the season is 300 yen for children and 500 yen for adults, allowing visitors to ride one time on the Ferris wheel for free. In the case of bad weather the park will be closed.

Fresh Greenery Light-up at Kajika-bashi (「河鹿橋」の新緑ライトアップ)

Located near the Kogane no Yu (golden hot spring source) and the Ikaho Rotenburo (open-air bath), Kajika-bashi over the Yuzawa River is famous for its autumn foliage, but the fresh greenery in early summer is also beautiful. The area around the bridge is lit up after sunset, allowing visitors to admire the beautiful contrast of the fresh green leaves against the red bridge during the day and night.

Lights will be on daily from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm until Sunday, June 15.

Free parking is available at the foot of the Kajika-bashi, but there is a limited number of parking spaces.

Shibukawa Tanabata Matsuri (渋川七夕まつり)

Tanabata Matsuri will be held at Shibukawa Ekimae, the street in front of the station, on Saturday, June 28, from 10:30 am to 3:00 pm. The street, from the intersection on the north side of the station to Hirasawa River, will be closed to vehicle traffic between between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm.

The festival features a variety of activities for visitors, including music and dance performances, stalls selling food and drink, and craft experiences. They can also write their wishes on colorful paper strips and hang them on bamboo branches.

Free parking is available at the Shibukawa City Hall Main Building and Second Building (Dainichosha).

TGR Rally Challenge in Shibukawa Ikaho

(TGR ラリーチャレンジ in 渋川伊香保)

The "TOYOTA GAZOO Racing Rally Challenge in Shibukawa Ikaho" will be held on Sunday, June 29, based at Shibukawa Sogo Koen (Comprehensive Park). A SS stage allows car and racing enthusiasts to witness the rally cars in action and appreciate their performance. This is a special opportunity to see the intense racing up close and to enjoy things like working vehicle rides, riding in a rally car, taking commemorative photos at photo spots, and public viewing.

A "Rally Park" event will be held within the park, and there will be a range of activities for families and friends to enjoy in conjunction with the Rally. In addition, there will be a number of food booths offering a diverse range of food, drinks, and local products.

Ancient Rice Planting and Harvesting Class (古代米づくり体験 教室)

In this class you will have a hands-on experience of producing Kodai-mai (ancient rice): Kuro-mai (black rice), Aka-mai (red rice), etc., from rice planting to harvesting.
